**Who is the SLC? What is the purpose/mission of the SLC? How long has it been around?
Who formed it?**

On March 7, 1975, representatives from fifteen institutions of higher education met with Mr. Laird Campbell, then Chairman of the State Personnel Board and Dr. G.D.I. Meyers, College of Business Administration, University of Colorado, to discuss their concerns and problems regarding the State Personnel System as it related to the institution of higher education. It was decided that it would be worthwhile to set up a statewide organization for state classified employees. A steering committee was appointed to outline how this could be achieved. As a result the Statewide Liaison of Higher Education Classified Staff (SLC/HE) was formed for the following purpose:

To establish a Statewide Personnel Council whose objectives and goals will be to serve all state personnel employees in the institutions of higher education and to better serve these institutions in the State of Colorado.

The Objectives are:

1. To have a sincere interest and concern for the continuing goals, purpose and functions of the institutions of higher education in Colorado.
2. To seek active representation and involvement of state personnel employees in the affairs of higher education in Colorado.
3. To provide an opportunity for state employees to participate in the achievement of goals and responsibilities and to lend a unit of purpose to the efforts of the entire educational community.
4. To act as a spokesperson for the needs and concerns of state personnel employees.
5. To provide a means through which state personnel employees may be represented and have a voice in making decisions that affect them and for which they have particular expertise.
6. To provide means through which a better understanding may be brought about between state personnel employees and the State Personnel System.
7. To seek to improve the public image of state personnel employees within the various institutions of higher education.
8. To provide a means of association and intercommunication among the state personnel employees within the institutions of higher education.
9. To assist in establishing a Personnel Council in every institution of higher education in the State of Colorado.

Who serves on SLC?

The Council consists of representatives of all Classified Employees from institutions of higher education in Colorado. A Classified Employee for the purpose of representation by the council shall be one who has certified status to a job or position in the Colorado State Personnel System as defined by the State Personnel System rules and regulations and by the Constitution of the State of Colorado and laws enacted pursuant thereto.

Representatives shall be selected by the staff councils of the institutions that they represent. Where there is no staff council, the manner of selection shall be determined by the individual institution. Selection of voting delegates and alternates shall be concluded within institutions by July 1 with service to begin after July 1. Notification of selections shall be sent to the SLC Secretary by each campus by July 1. There will be one voting delegate and one alternate per State institutional campus.

Is there a Board or Executive Committee?

The officers of this council include a President, Vice President, Secretary, Treasurer, and four regional representatives. Any institutional representative is considered to be eligible to hold one of these offices. No more than two (2) individuals from a specific institution may serve as an Executive Committee Member.

How often does it meet? Where? Are all higher education institutions included?

Regular meetings shall be held on or around the 1st Friday of February, April, August, and November. Meetings shall be hosted as follows: February – Central Region; April – Executive Board’s Discretion; August – Western Region; November – even-numbered years to be hosted by Southern Region, and odd-numbered years to be hosted by Northern Region. Exceptions shall be approved by a majority vote of the Council.
